Prior to that Dave has over 20 years of experience in Business Management, Merchandise and Marketing. He has over 20 years of active Structural Fire Service both as a Firefighter and Fire Chief; he has worked with the Upper Nicola Indian Band and the Coldwater Indian Band respectively as their Band Administrator and Fire Chief.

Dave is extensively involved with Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) both as an instructor for Group Crisis Intervention and Individual Crisis Intervention & Peer Support certificate workshops for the International Critical Incident Stress Foundation (ICISF,) as well a coordinator and provider for crisis interventions. He holds certification as a provider and instructor for TFT (Thought Field Therapy), an alternative therapy used in the trauma field. He holds certification as a Certified Trauma Responder (CTR) with the Association of Traumatic Stress Specialists (ATSS). Dave also has training in HEARTMATH, heart rate variability applications are used in Stress Management Techniques. A qualified instructor and provider for CPR, holds EMA First Responder level III, Spinal Management and AED endorsements He currently remains active with a number of other Emergency Response Agencies, providing crisis management and other services to individuals and communities.

Dave is extensively involved within his community; a volunteer with the local Community Policing Office, a certified trainer / instructor for Hockey Canada Safety Program for the BC Amateur Hockey Association and also serves as the off-ice medical coordinator for the Merritt Centennials Junior A Hockey Club of the BCHL and also the Vice President of the Centennials as well as the Team Chaplain.
